He also advises regularly on international maritime regulatory issues, including those relating to MARPOL. Alessio has an international practice, which involves him advising and representing the main stakeholders in the physical shipping and off-shore chains across the globe. He also presents regularly on behalf of BIMCO on this topic.
